- Use a small children's pool to stand in to remove PPE (doffing). (Submitted by Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital-Flower Mound)

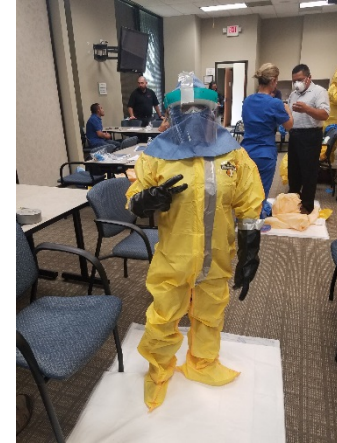
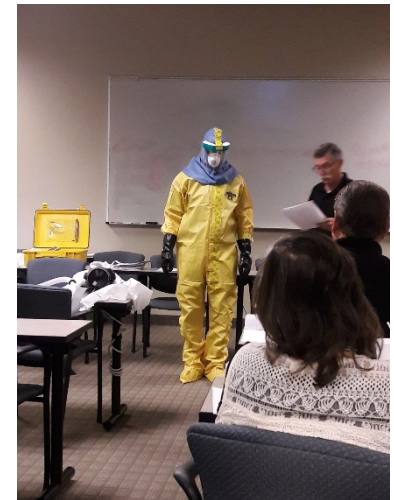

Patient Decontamination

- PPE suits Tychem QC (not the Tychem BR suits; these suits are too difficult for donning the level C PAPR)
- Need cones and caution for set up of decontamination zone
- Add sponges, brushes, soap, and buckets to donning/doffing kits
- Purchase headset/radios for DECON team in PPE
- Before you get into a suit and when you get out of a suit, you must have vitals taken and drink water.
- Include a personal belonging bag in the post decon kits.
