LEARNING OBJECTIVES

The 2018 ALERRT Conference will incorporate thought leaders from law enforcement, fire, EMS, and new this year, physicians. Based on recent active shooter / intentional mass injury events in the United States, this reflects the reality that saving victims' lives does not end in an ambulance or at the door of the emergency department.

- 3. Identify the principles of High Reliability Organizing.
- 4. Recognize systems capable of adaptive learning during periods of chaos and complexity.
