
Nationwide Pediatric Surge

- Hospitals nationwide reporting widespread pediatric surge
 - Pediatric hospitals operating near or at capacity
 - Increased difficulty in pediatric transfers, non-pediatric hospitals having to hold pediatric patients longer than normal and transfer further
 - Primarily respiratory, with very recent increase in influenza
 - Right now, no state or federal funding for Pediatric Surge response activities
- Being monitored at state and federal levels
 - ASPR Information Request October 26, 2022
 - No 1135 Waivers w/o Disaster Declaration
 - ASPR "looking into" funding, possible modification of COVID Disaster Declaration
 - ASPR Survey HCC Pediatric Surge Activities November 7, 2022


Pediatric MedSurg/Floor Beds

 - Internal Solutions OT incentives, team nursing, stretching nurse/patient ratios, etc.
 - External Solutions Using staffing agencies

- Is staff sharing across hospitals an option?
 - Non-Pediatric hospitals sending staff with pedi experience to work at pediatric hospitals?
