



FY21 Revenue Horizon State Contracts

- EMS RAC funding increased 188%
 - Base funding increased 44% from \$305K in FY20 to \$439K in FY21
 - Received additional \$439K to align funding term to fiscal year
- EMS RAC Systems Development funding remains flat
- Local Projects Grants—no details available for FY21
 - -Received \$78K for UV Sanitizer project in FY20
- EMS County (Pass-through) funding increased 157%
 - Base funding increased 29% from \$373K in FY20 to \$481K in FY21
 - Received additional \$481K to align funding term to fiscal year













Demographics Location



How Many Individuals Have you Trained in STB Since 2019?






Stroke Survey Areas

Stroke Preferred Courses








