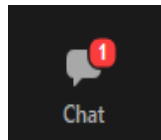

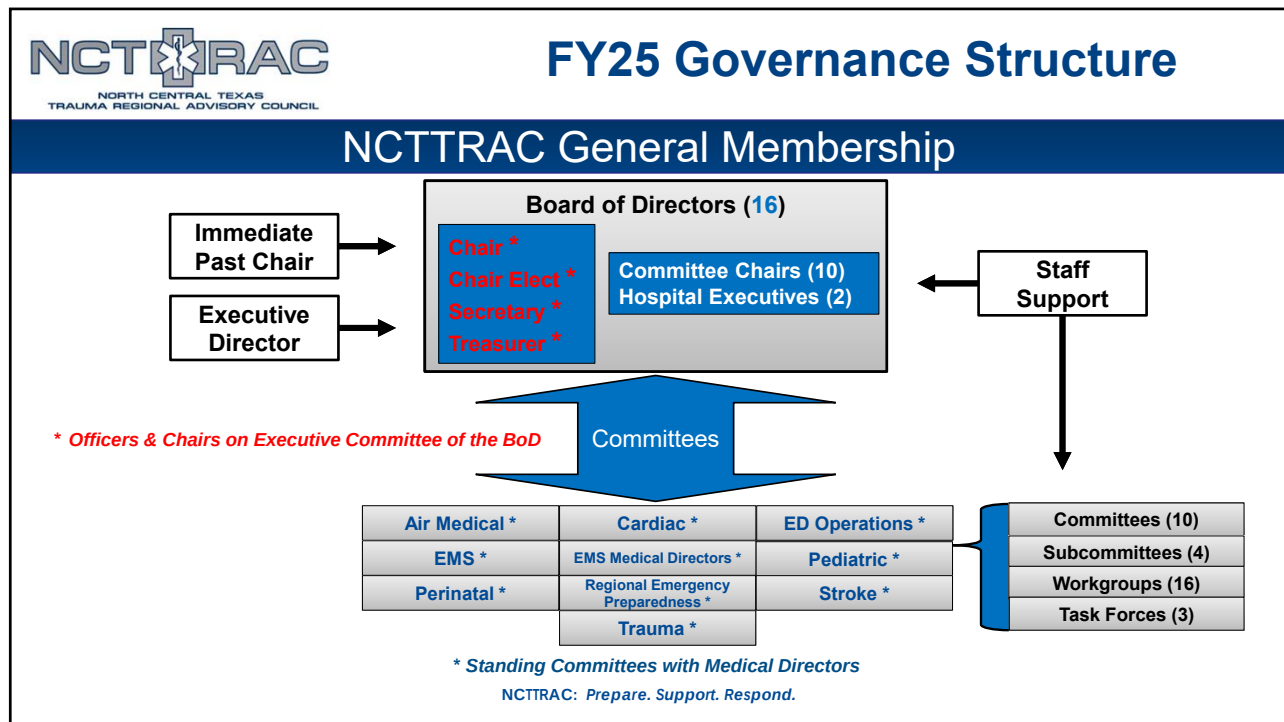

TETAF Update

- TETAF Advocacy Report highlights from the 89th Legislative Session:
 - **HB 18** (Rep. Gary VanDeaver (R-New Boston): Provides **\$100 million to improve health care in rural Texas** – went into effect immediately
 - **HB 37** (Rep. Mihaela Plesa, D-Plano): Appropriates **\$5 million to provide perinatal bereavement care and devices**.
 - **HB 3000** (Rep. Ken King, R-Canadian): Appropriates **\$90 million** to a grant program to provide financial assistance to qualified **ambulance service providers in certain rural counties** – goes into effect September 1, 2025.
 - **SB 672** (Sen. Bryan Hughes, R-Mineola): Requires that certain **hospitals submit a summary of parts of their emergency diversion plans** to the Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) – goes into effect September 1, 2025.
 - **SB 1018** (Sen. Joan Huffman, R-Houston): **Increases the percentage amount of traffic fine revenue deposited to the designated trauma facility** and emergency medical services Account 5111 from 30% to 50% - estimated increase of \$16 million per year to the account that helps to fund hospitals, EMS, and RACs.
 - **SB 1233** (Sen. Kelly Hancock, R-North Richland Hills): Concerns information regarding **perinatal palliative care and creates an administrative penalty** – goes into effect September 1, 2025.

Pulsara Daily Use Active Participation Requirement

- Pulsara Utilization Workgroup has recommended that daily use of Pulsara become a NCTTRAC Active Participation requirement
- Pulsara Utilization Workgroup finalizes recommendation/language
 - COMPLETE, March 20, 2025
- Recommendation is discussed among other committees
 - COMPLETE, April/May 2025
- Recommendation is brought to the Board of Directors
 - COMPLETE, May 13, 2025 (BoD Approved Recommendation)
- Recommendation is built into the Membership & Participation SOP and is sent to the General Membership for vote
 - VOTING PERIOD OPENS August 21 – September 5, 2025

Current Active Participation Requirements

- Active Participation is defined in Membership & Participation SOP
- Each committee can set committee-specific AP requirements
- Failing to meet Active Participation requirements affects:
 - NCTTRAC Voting Privileges
 - EMS County Assistance Funds (EMS Agencies Only)
 - Designation Support Letters (Hospitals Only)
- Current Active Participation Requirements:
 - Meeting Attendance (6 meetings over at least 3 quarters)
 - Voting & Survey Responses
 - Data Submission

Active Participation Requirement: Specific Language

- 3.3.4 Pulsara Daily Use
 - 3.3.4.1 The following requirements related to daily use of Pulsara will become effective on September 1st, 2026 to be an Active Participation requirement for Fiscal Year 2027 and onwards. These requirements only apply to 911 patients transported by EMS to a hospital. Interfacility transfers and “walk-in” patients are not included in the requirements below.
 - 3.3.4.1.1 Each EMS agency must create a Pulsara patient channel and share it with the receiving hospital on at least 50% of their 911 patient transports.
 - 3.3.4.1.2 Each hospital must acknowledge in Pulsara at least 50% of the total number of patient channels sent to the facility by an EMS agency.
 - 3.3.4.1.3 The required percentages in items 3.3.4.1.1 and 3.3.4.1.2 will increase annually based on the schedule identified below:
 - 3.3.4.1.3.1 FY27: 50% | FY28: 60% | FY29: 70% | FY30 (and beyond): 80%

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Active Participation Requirement: Additional Details

- “Each EMS Agency must create a Pulsara patient channel and share it with the receiving hospital on at least **50%** of their patient transports”
 - Total # of Patient Channels created & sent to hospitals (Pulsara) / Total # of EMS Transports (DSHS EMSTR)
 - “Total # of EMS Transports” to be determined by averaging the last 2 years worth of data from the DSHS EMSTR
- “Each hospital must acknowledge in Pulsara at least **50%** of the total number of patient channels sent to the facility by an EMS agency”
 - Total # of EMS patient channels acknowledged (Pulsara) / Total # of EMS patient channels sent to hospital (Pulsara)
- Go-live date is 9/1/2026; required percentage will increase by 10% to a max of 80% each Fiscal Year
- Requirement is annual, but NCTTRAC will show status quarterly
- Utilization data to be pulled from Pulsara by NCTTRAC, but if data isn’t available by implementation date then agencies/hospitals will submit quarterly aggregate reports to NCTTRAC

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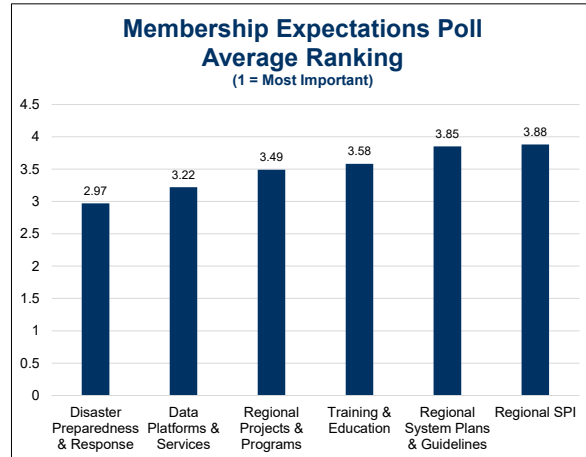

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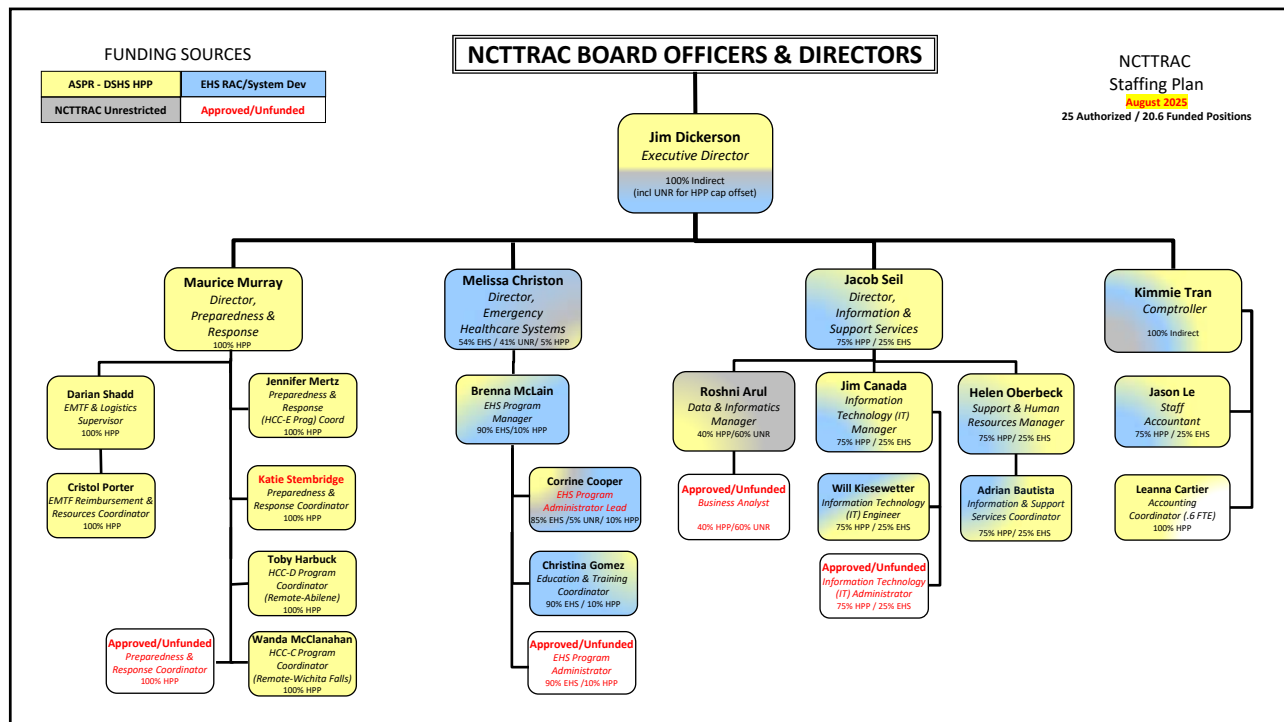

- HPP Contract Extension with DSHS for July 1, 2025 - June 30, 2026
 - DSHS received Notice of Award (NOA) for 8 months/66% of projected funding
 - DSHS ‘anticipates’ full federal funding to come by February 2026
 - No contract amendment requested; NCTTRAC operating with 33% ‘contingency’ funds in each budget category until full funding is confirmed
- HPP Request for Application (RFA) 2026 – 2030 submitted in July
 - Five-year block grant
 - \$61M total funding for the state
- EMTF-GR increase \$1.5M annual/\$3M biennium; distribution TBD
- \$10M appropriated to Prehospital Blood Transfusion for biennium
 - EHS to update on state Task Force and potential funding distribution

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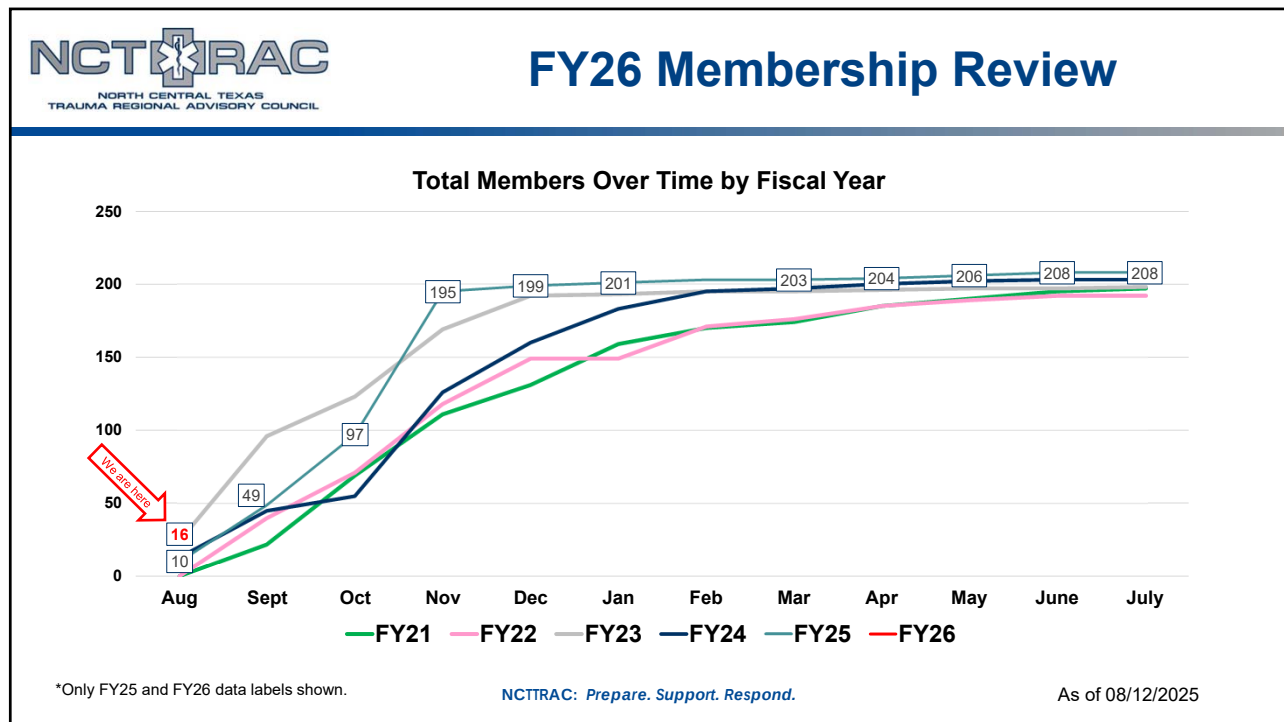

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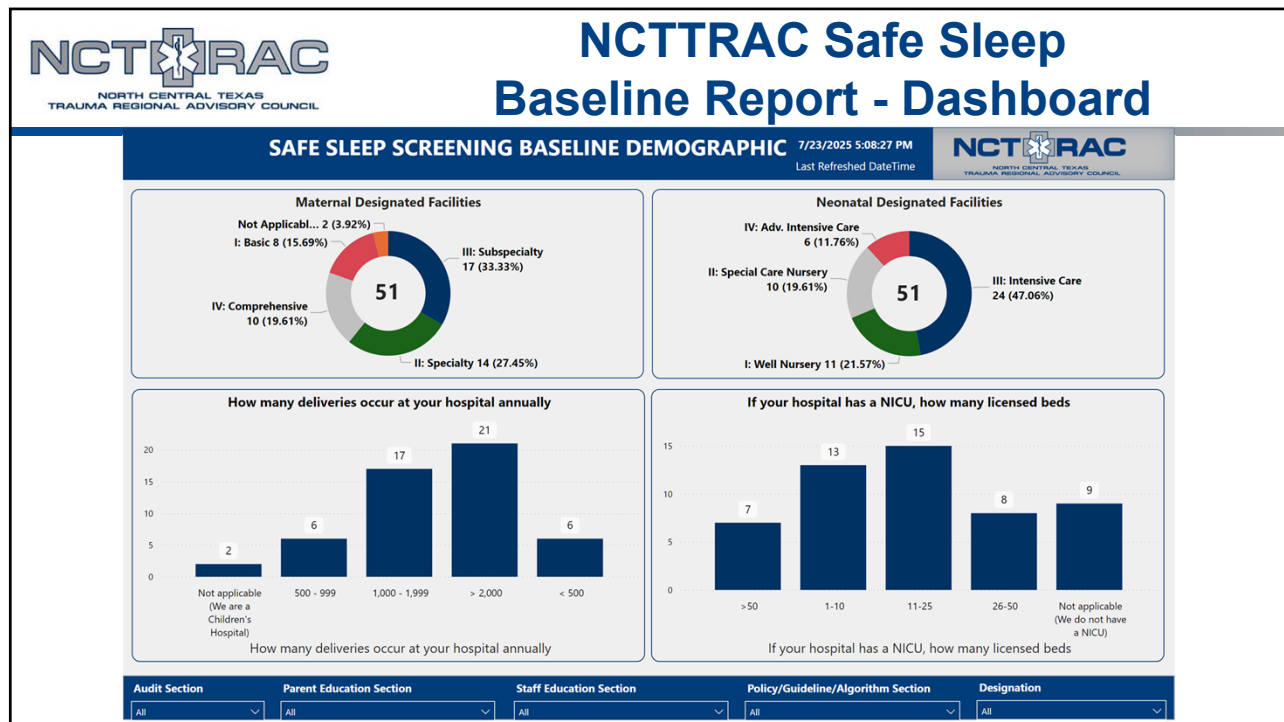
NCTTRAC Safe Sleep Baseline Report - Dashboard

The NCTTRAC Safe Sleep Baseline Report dashboard was developed using results from the baseline survey, which provided an initial analysis of current regional processes within PCR-E designated facilities. Data was collected from 51 perinatal-designated facilities between April and May 2025, with plans to follow up on progress after implementing regional best practices, educational resources, and newly developed guidelines.

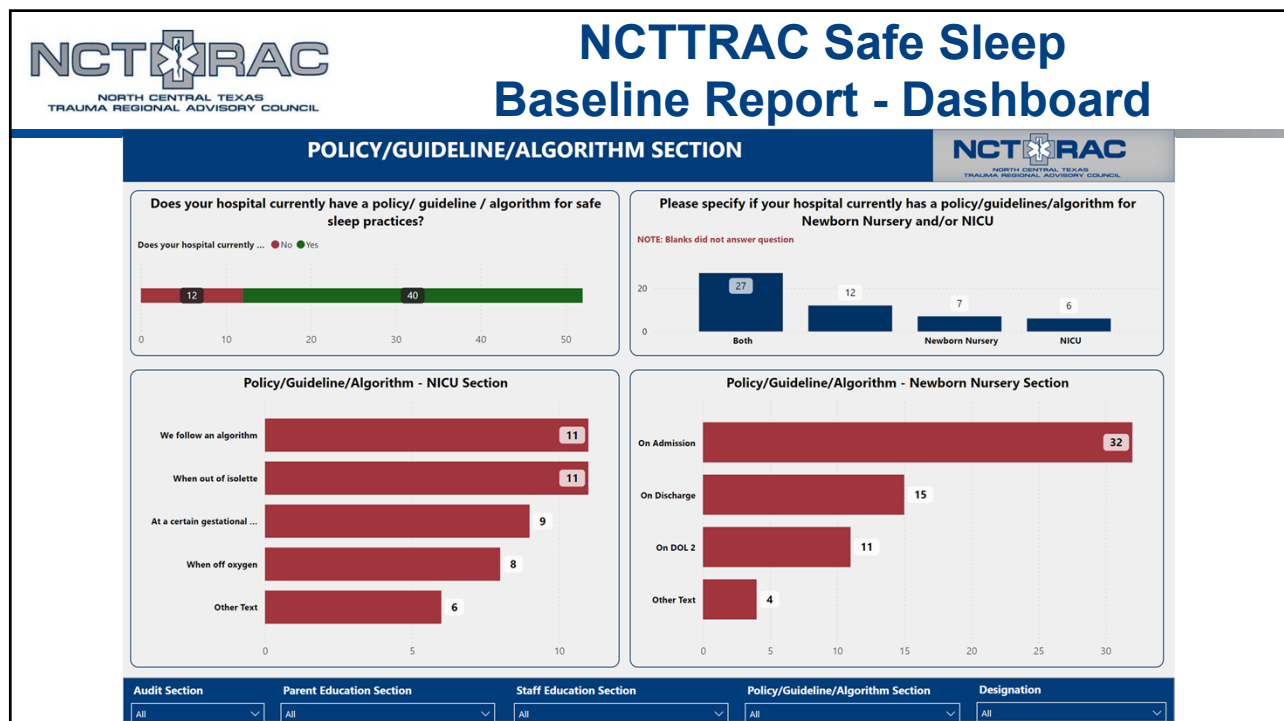

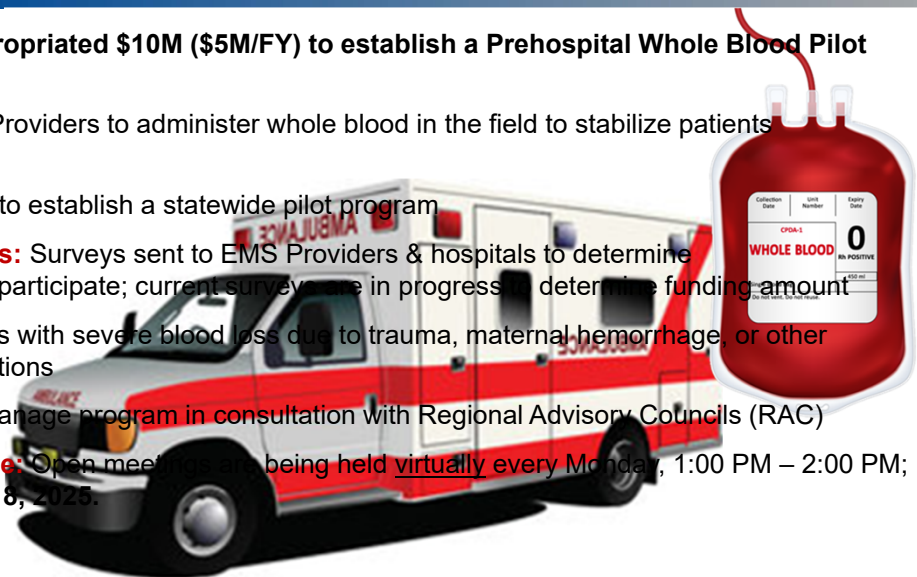
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DSHS Prehospital Whole Blood Pilot Program

Texas legislation has appropriated \$10M (\$5M/FY) to establish a Prehospital Whole Blood Pilot Program.

- **Purpose:** Enable EMS Providers to administer whole blood in the field to stabilize patients with severe bleeding
- **Statewide scope:** Aims to establish a statewide pilot program
- **Hospital & EMS surveys:** Surveys sent to EMS Providers & hospitals to determine willingness/readiness to participate; current surveys are in progress to determine funding amount
- **Target patients:** Patients with severe blood loss due to trauma, maternal hemorrhage, or other significant medical conditions
- **Oversight:** DSHS will manage program in consultation with Regional Advisory Councils (RAC)
- **GETAC PHWB taskforce:** Open meetings are being held virtually every Monday, 1:00 PM – 2:00 PM; next meeting **AUGUST 18, 2025.**
