Description of Scenario: 20 beauty school students we in class when a box of bleach powder fell off of the shelf and contaminated the students. Students began showing symptoms of contamination. Instructors called the police, students were instructed to go to Stephens Memorial for decontamination and treatment.					
Objectives for this drill/exercise: At the end of this drill, class participants at Stephens Memorial will be able to understand the flow and set up the hazmat tent. Class participants will also demonstrate efficient proper donning and doffing of PPE.

Notes: During the drill, it was demonstrated and observed patient support was very good. Patients were contaminated in the hot zone and all of the zones were correctly set up. Supplies were set up and ready to conduct a patient decontamination.					

Other considerations: Some of the considerations to be noted- Stephens Memorial is in need of a bladder for containment and a sump pump.			
Objectives met: The objectives set for this drill were met by Stephens Memorial. The team/class members were able to successfully set up and stage the hazmat area, understand the set-up zones, equipment storage and needs, patient flow and gain a full understanding of where their facility would conduct a hazmat patient decontamination if one were needed at this facility. Properly demonstrate their ability to don and doff PPE.
